



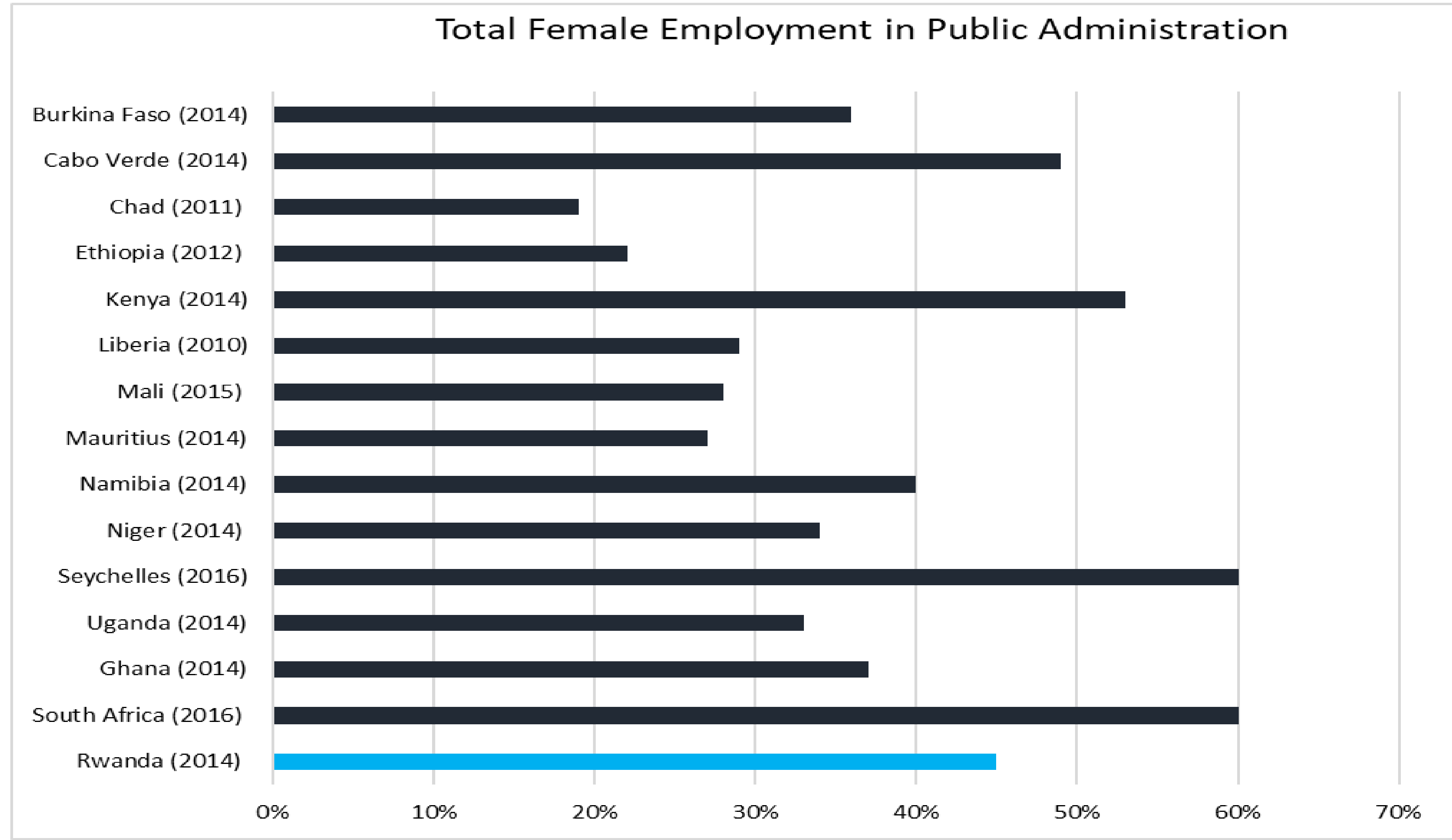
# Rwanda: Initial Findings of Women in Public Administration and Gender Parity Before and After Conflict
